

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS GO BAGS

<u>Purpose: Contain important documents, supplies and emergency</u> gear in one place for easy access and a rapid exit from the premises.

Think of Go Bags as 2 types -

<u>Medical</u> – such as power outage or hospitalization <u>Evacuation</u> – such as fire

Most items should "live" in the Go Bag

Items will be needed that can't be kept in the Go Bag, (e.g. Mouth guard, glasses), should be on a list in your Bag so they won't be forgotten

Contents of the Medical Go Bag:

"DON'T FORGET CARD" - A list of things to add to the bag before you leave --

Such as Glasses, dentures, clothes

Documents:

DCV Emergency Contact names and numbers DCV Health Information Sheet (include information on location of Health Care Power of Attorney (HC POA) and Living Will Copies of HC POA and Living Will

Medical and Surgical history if available

Copy of a government ID:

Driver's License, passport, Other _____ Social Security Card Medicare Card Insurance Cards

A week supply of medication Pain Medication (e.g. Aspirin, Tylenol) Cell Phone Phone Charger "Comfort things" (maybe warm socks, religious items, ear plugs, eye shades, travel size toiletries, etc.) Small amount of money



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Contents of Evacuation Go Bag:

Your Medical Go Bag PLUS Bottled water Flash light Batteries Whistle Duct Tape Scissors Garbage bags for sanitation purposes Can opener Mylar Blanket or tarp Face Mask (for dust) Money – in small bills Credit Cards – (more than 1 if you have them) Comfortable closed toe shoes to walk in Entertainment – Consider a book, puzzle, iPad, Kindle, cards Chargers Head Phones Ear plugs Face/Eye mask (for sleep) Maps/Phone numbers of safe destinations **Light Weight Foods** Pet Supplies /Food

In the Car:

Gas tank always at least ½ full Warm clothes Emergency car supplies Blankets Tire inflating propellant Plugs to charge cell phone and computer in auto lighter
